Anatomy of an episode

- **Trigger** — a scheduled life event whose numbers visibly move the household's 96-month trajectory.
- **Options, with the rules attached** — each option a firm would consider carries a permitted flag and the cited fact keys that allow or block it.
- **Recommendation** — the first permitted option in the decision type's policy order; deterministic.
- **Resolution** — follow, override (with a recorded reason), or escalate; overrides of \$50,000 or more always escalate to compliance.
- **Outcome** — what executed and with what status, including funded amounts per source when money moved.
- **QA tasks** — emitted at generation time with answer keys, evidence ids, and deterministic distractors.
